Background

- President Barack Obama signed WIOA into law on July 22, 2014.
- Passed by Congress with wide bipartisan majority (the Senate voted 93-5 and the House of Representatives voted 415-6).
- Broad vision of workforce programs: reaffirms ongoing role of American Job Centers and also requires coordination and alignment of key employment, education, and training programs.

Background

- Promotes program alignment at the Federal, State, local, and regional levels.
- Builds on proven practices such as sector strategies, career pathways, regional economic approaches, work-based training.
- Complements and supports the President's Job-Driven
 Workforce Vision and the Vice President's Job-Driven
 Training Report released on July 22, 2014.

What the Act Does....

- Aligns Federal investments to support job seekers
- Strengthens governing bodies
- Helps employers find workers with necessary skills
- Aligns goals and increases accountability
- Fosters regional collaboration
- Targets workforce services to better serve job seekers



- Requires states to align programs
 - Four year strategy
 - Single unified plan
- Promotes accountability
 - Evidence based, data driven and accountable to participants
 - Core performance indicators
 - Measure the effectiveness of employer services

- Improves the American Job Center System
 - Must be certified every three years
 - Employment Services (Wagner-Peyser) co-location
 - TANF is a required partner
 - States are encouraged to integrate data systems, case management and intake
 - Funding dedicated to infrastructure



- Provides Access to High Quality Training
 - Emphasis on training that leads to industry recognized credentials
 - Addition of additional procurement vehicles for training



- Makes key investments in serving disconnected youth and other vulnerable populations
 - □ 75% of funds must be spent on OSY
 - 20% of funds must be spent on work experience
 - Removed income barrier for most OSY
 - Raises OSY age to 24



- Enhances Job Corps
- Reinforces connections with apprenticeship
- Improves services to individuals with disabilities



WIOA Timeline

- January 18, 2015: DOL, ED and HHS must publish
 Notice of Proposed Rule Making
- □ July 1, 2015: All provisions take effect
- January 22, 2016: DOL, ED and HHS must publish final rule

 - \$24 million competition
