Executive Order 01.01.2005.36




- **STATE ADMINISTRATING AGENCY:**

- In the application for, and administration of, Federal and State funds for public safety, crime control & prevention

- **Promote and Coordinate:**

- Public Safety linkages and partnerships between/among federal state and local agencies






State Administering Agency (SAA)

- Designated State Administering Agency
- 10 full time grant monitors
- 45 federal and state programs administered
- 789 grants in FY 2014 totaling over \$118 Million
 - Over 4,900 programmatic reports reviewed
 - 80 site visits conducted

Benefits of Regional Monitoring

- Establish one point of contact to streamline communications
- Promote coordinated and cooperative strategies
- Leverage scarce resources
- Allocate resources based on needs
- Identify and share best/promising practices
- Improve flexibility

Statewide Goal: To Reduce Crimes Against Women and Children by 25%

- On any given day \$17 Million in victims funding is on the street
- Providing aid to all victims including:
 - Domestic Violence
 - Sexual Assault
 - Stalking
 - Dating Violence
 - Victims of Crime

Victims' Funding

- Examples of Projects Funded:
 - Temporary and transitional housing
 - Hospital Based DV programs
 - Bilingual advocates
 - Law enforcement serving protective orders
 - Coordinated community response



Victims' Funding

- Examples of Projects Funded:
 - Child abuse prevention and training
 - Sexual Assault Response Teams (SARTs)
 - Dedicated prosecutors
 - 24/7 Crisis hotlines
 - Safety planning



Status of Goal

- As of October 16, 2014:
- Female and juvenile homicides have been driven down by 26.1%.



Statewide Goal: To Reduce Violent Crime in MD by 20%

- On any given day over \$100 Million in criminal justice/law enforcement funding is on the street (in addition to victims' funds).
- Providing aid to all agencies including:
 - Sheriff's Offices, Police Departments, Corrections
 - State Agencies, Local Management Boards
 - State's Attorney's Offices, Courts
 - Non-profit organizations

 - Violent Offender Warrant Initiative
 - Gun Violence Reduction strategies



Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement Funding

- Examples of Projects Funded:
 - Body Armor
 - Law Enforcement Equipment
 - DNA Testing
 - DMC projects
 - School Bus Safety Enforcement
 - Sex Offender Management
 - LPR systems



Status of Goal

- Violent crime has been driven down to its lowest point since 1975, a 27.3% decrease since 2006.
- Homicides have been driven down to their 2nd lowest level since 1985, a 29.3% decrease since 2006.
