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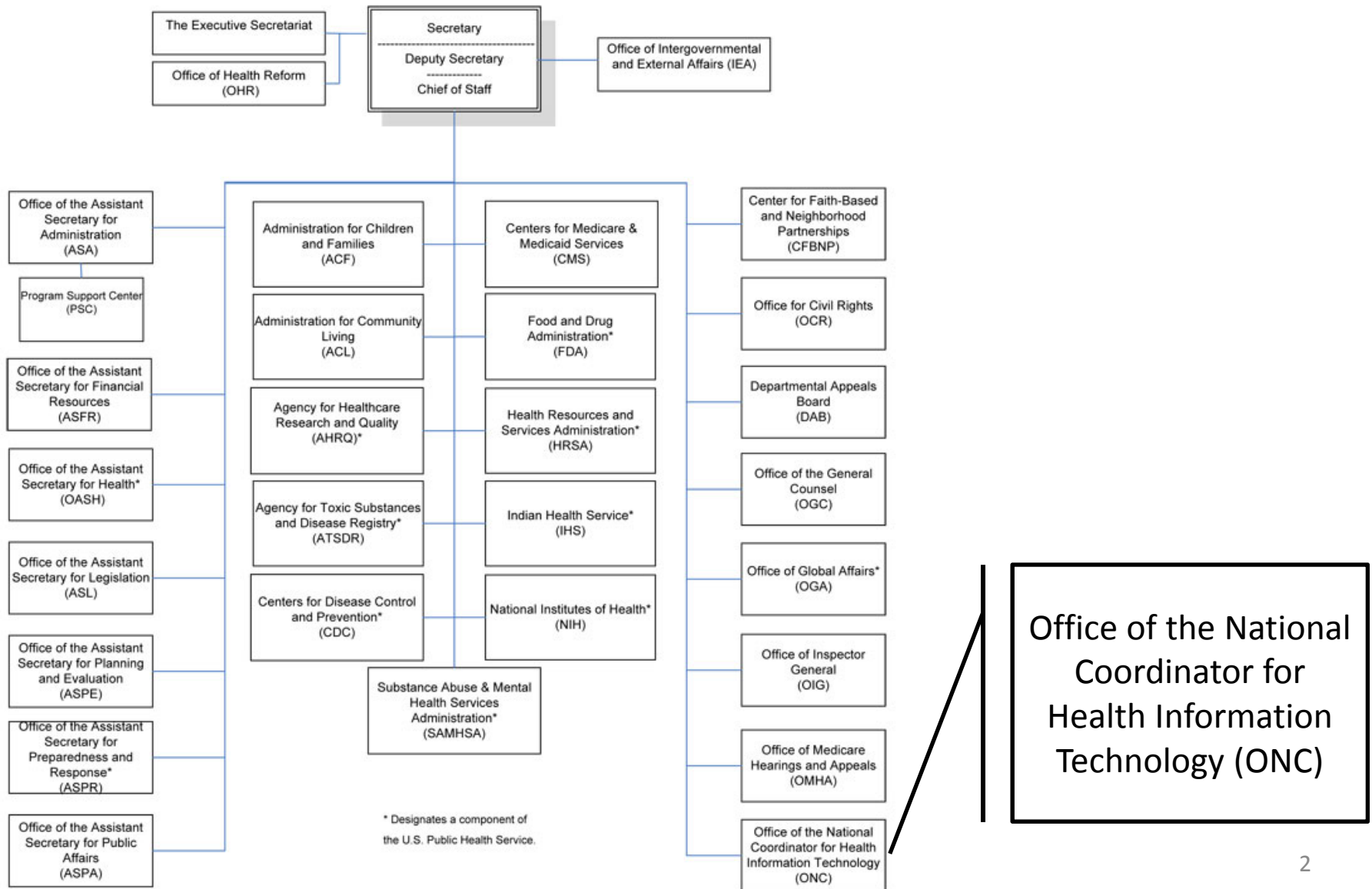

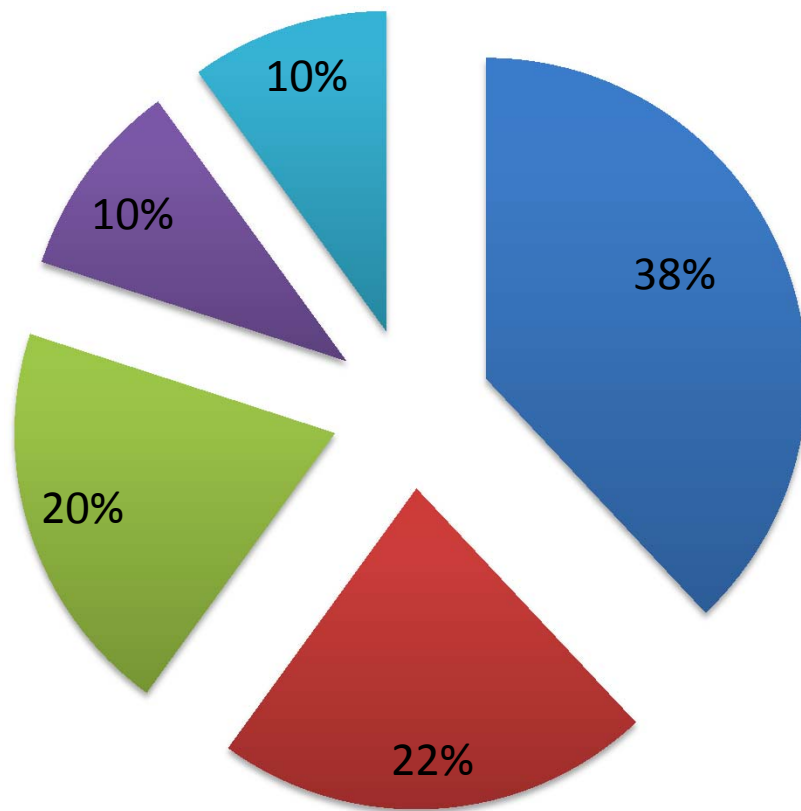

# The Office of the National Coordinator for HealthIT Programs

- **Beacon Community Program**
  - Beacon is a grant program for communities to build and strengthen their health IT infrastructure and exchange capabilities; improve cost quality and population health; and test innovative approaches to performance technology integration and care delivery.
- **Regional Extension Center Program**
  - ONC has awarded grant funding to 62 Regional Extension Centers to help more than 100,000 primary care providers adopt and use electronic health records.
- **State Health Information Exchange**
  - State HIE is a grant program to support States or State Designated Entities in establishing health information exchange capability among healthcare providers and hospitals in their jurisdictions.
- **Strategic Health IT Advanced Research Projects**
  - SHARP is a grant program to fund research focused on achieving breakthrough advances to address well-documented problems in EHR adoption.
- **Workforce Programs**
  - The Community College Consortia, Curriculum Develop Centers, Program of Assistance for University-Based Training and Competency Examination programs help address the growing demand for Health IT experts to support in the adoption and use of electronic health records.

## HHS Program Integrity Initiatives

The **Program Integrity Coordinating Council (PICC)** was created by the Secretary and is comprised of Direct Report Representatives from each operating division that meet monthly and share best practices and discuss program integrity issues throughout HHS

### HHS Wide Initiatives

The **Quarterly Risk Analysis** is a risk based monitoring program which includes a review of financial status reports, analysis of drawdown reports, desk reviews and on-site monitoring, as well as YIRs to determine the risk of every grantee to determine if further monitoring is required.

To further the HHS-wide focus on grant **Closeout**, OGM has created the **Grant-In-Review** tool which is a comprehensive tool used to ensure that all grant requirements, programmatic and financial, have been met prior to closeout.

A **Site Visit** is a form of monitoring where ONC personnel travel to the grantees' offices to review systems, files, policies and procedures to ensure compliance and acceptable performance.

### ONC Wide Initiatives

The **Year in Review (YIR)** process consists of a comprehensive review of each grant award to improve oversight of ONC's programs. Upon completion of the review, results are scored and ranked based on the criteria and are used to steer ONC monitoring plans.
