







#### SGR's Funded Grant Framework





- Fall/ Spring

- Cities, Housing Authorities
- Housing, People, Neighborhoods
- Planning-\$500K; Implementation- \$50M
- Jan 2023

## Education



#### USDA Farm to School

- Nonprofits, public entities, schools, etc.
- Make local food and agricultural education available to child nutrition program participants through grants, research, technical assistance, and training
- \$100,000-\$500,000
- Jan 2023

#### Dept Ed Promise Neighborhoods

- Multi-sectoral; \$6M
- Priority 1: Strengthening Cross-Agency Coordination and Community Engagement to Advance Systemic Change.
- Priority 2: Increasing Postsecondary Education Access, Affordability, Completion, and Post-Enrollment Success.
- Priority 3: Evidence-Based Activities to Support Academic Achievement
